Selecting a Team Coach

On Muster day – one of the parents from your team is required to volunteer to be the Team Coach. The team coach is responsible for showing the kids how to play soccer and liaising with the Team Manager. The coaches are offered training sessions on “how to coach” as well as having our Technical Director to help guide you.

It’s also a great idea to have an assistant coach to help too!

Selecting a Team Manager

U10, U11 & U12 Teams



Players are emailed and advised what team they have been placed into for the year, with advice who the team coach and manager are, from there the team manager will take over communications and advise when the team will start training.

Team Coach

Coaches have volunteered to coach for the season. The coaches are offered training sessions on “how to coach” as well as having our Technical Director to help guide you. It’s also a great idea to have an assistant coach to help too!

Team Manager

Managers have volunteered to manage for the season.

The team Manager is responsible for looking after the communication within the team, letting parents know when games are, passing on messages from the team coach and the club.

The team managers have a Managers Coordinator who will pass information onto managers for the team manager for the team, she is also there to guide managers throughout the season.

Training days and times

Under 6 to Under 12 teams – train once a week.

The training session goes for approx. 45min to an hour and will be either 5-6pm or 6-7pm

When is our first game ?

Game Day

Miniroo games are held on Saturday's, game times are advised closer to the game day. Games are normally scheduled from 8.30am onwards.

This information will be provided to you by your team manager. The team draws information is located on the Football Queensland website.

Games for the younger children are normally in the local Moreton bay region. On game day the players should arrive 20- 30min before the start of their game this allows the coach to do a warmup with the kids and time for the children to change into their playing jersey's.

Game duration – these change in each age group, but they are as per the Mini-roo guidelines.

Team Playing Jersey's

On game day the children are supplied with a jersey to wear for the game, at the end of the game all jerseys are handed back in.

The children do not get to take their “own” one home as we are trying to teach the children teamwork and sportsmanship.

Each child in the team takes a turn at taking them home to wash the team's jerseys. Your team manager will provide a “Washing Roster” to the parents.

Fruit Break – Game Day

Teams may opt to do fruit break at half time, with the players.

No fruit is to be taken on the synthetic fields

Club Communication

Any information from the club will be placed onto the main facebook page or given to the team manager via the Coach & Managers Facebook group



Team Communication

The team manager will be the one who will communicate all information from the club and your team coach.

Forms of communication can be:

- Facebook – Team may have facebook pages but are the sole responsibility of the teams and they are non-club affiliated.
- Email
- Text Message
- Messenger Groups

Wet Weather

Your manager will advise if a training session has been cancelled due to wet weather on training nights and game days. Training nights – this information will be available on the club's main Facebook Page.

We request you do not PM the club page or any of the coordinators, we see the closures at the same time as players, no post on the Clubs main page means the fields are open.

Game days – please refer to the clubs facebook page where you are playing the game. Also you can check field closures on the Football Queensland website.

Wet Weather Process

Training Days / Nights

If training is cancelled it will be announced on the clubs main Facebook page first, then later put onto the coach & managers pages.

A decision is typically made after 3-4pm on the day.

If there is no post training is still on.



Ground Officials

Each parent will take turns at being a ground official for home games for your team's game. The team manager will provide a roster for the team. Each kit will have a vest in the bag for this. More information will be advised at muster. The team manager and team coach are not permitted to be ground officials.



Carnivals

Throughout the season clubs offer carnivals for the miniroos to compete in against other clubs in an all-day event – the kids normally play four games. It is a great way to get to know your team. This is an optional addition for your teams and there is a fee that the players have to pay if they want to participate.

Costs of this are advised by the club holding the carnival – details are provided normally in the supplied flyers from the other clubs.

Your team manager will advise the parents in your team of carnivals when information is available.



Uniforms

Registration fees for 2024 include all association fees, match fees and referee fees, there are no additional fees to pay and No Volunteer Levies to pay.

Apparel:

- Club Polo Shirt
- Training Shirt
- Shorts
- Socks
- Game shirt provided each week – which is returned at the end of the season

Parents need to purchase:

- Shin Pads (the children will not be able to play without these)
- Football Boots (the children will not be able to play without these) (Parent are encouraged to purchase shin pads and boots from Intersport Morayfield as these are sponsors of our club)

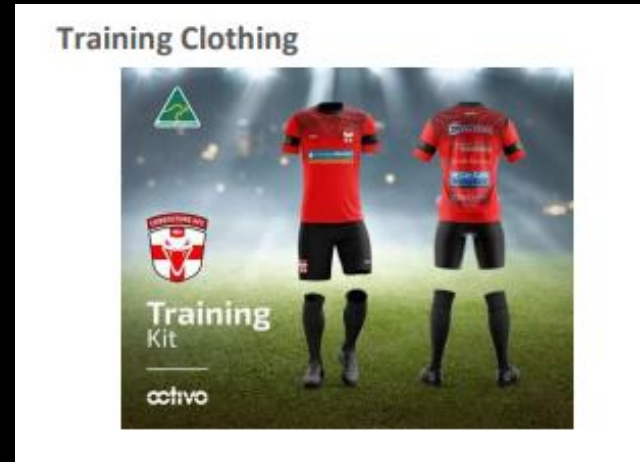


Uniforms

Team Coach & Manager Responsibilities

Make sure the kids have fun!

Coaches Responsibilities

Are to help kids have fun with a round ball. To play as a team while using fair play the game of Football comes second at such a young age.

Manager Responsibilities

The team manager looks after communication for the team and helps the coach with the administration tasks of football – in Miniroos this is washing/ground official rosters and advise of game times and days, as well as passing on any information from the coach to the parents.

Weekly encouragement awards

This is something that the team coach and team manager arrange for their team. It's up to the manager / coach how they want to arrange this. This is something small to give the kids encouragement throughout the season.

For example, a "Player of the match" award. This is what some teams in the past have done: Trophy Purchase (one) trophy and share it among the team members each week – the children have it for a week and then is returned for the next recipient. The award being for player of the match. Certificate & treat Make up your own certificate and print it out and pop it with a little treat of a lollypop or a party flavor. Copy of our logo will be available on the coach & managers Facebook group. Try to make it so each child gets an award by the end of the season.

Parents responsibilities

Parents are needed to stay on the grounds with their own children.

If your child is unwell and / or not able to make a game or a training session, please let your team manager know as soon as you can.

Parents are to hand in team jersey's at the end of each game and take turns at washing the teams game day shirts. The kit is required to stay together.

Parents are to conduct all communication through their team manager not the coach, this allows the coach to focus on the kids and playing football.



Photos / Trophies

Parents are requested to check the spelling of their child's name on Muster day and update if required as well as check spelling during photo and trophy times.

The club has team photos in the middle of the season.
