



1. PARENT/SPECTATOR STANDARDS & RESPONSIBILITIES

1.1 Remember that children play FOOTBALL for their enjoyment not yours.

1.2 Do not coach or provide any instructions to your child during training or games. Continued disregard to this will result in said parent being required to not attend training and games, and worse case the player being released from the program.

1.3 Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.

1.4 Encourage children to always participate according to the rules.

1.5 Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a match.

1.6 Remember that children learn best by example. Applaud good plays by all teams.

1.7 Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.

1.8 Respect official's decisions and teach children to do likewise.

1.9 Show appreciation of volunteer coaches, officials, and administrators. Without them your child could not participate.

1.10 The consumption of alcohol and smoking is inappropriate at all junior football games.

1.11 Advise any family member/supporters attending of the code of conduct, and address any issues immediately

1.12 The Parent agrees to abide by the club's social media policies, which can be found on the club's website for reference or download.

1.13 The Parent agrees to not be involved in any social media posts that could bring the club, player, squad, sponsors, or members of the club into disrepute.

1.14 The parent agrees and acknowledges the importance and repercussions of negative social media comments or posts and the effect this can have on the club, player, squad, sponsors, and members of the club

1.15 If the Parent is found to be in breach of the club's social media policy whether on the club's own social media platforms or on the player's own personal social media platforms, the player may be requested to attend a disciplinary meeting with the Coaching Staff and Operations Committee members to show cause as to why this playing agreement is not terminated.

If a parent/spectator is found to be in breach of the club's parent code of conduct, the parent/spectator may be requested to attend a meeting with the Coaching Staff and Operations Committee members to show cause as to why their child's playing agreement is not terminated.
